TEACHER TRAINING ON PHILIPPINE HISTORY AND HERITAGE

The National Historical Institute (NHI) in cooperation with the Department of Education (DepED) will conduct a series of two-day Teacher Training on Philippine History and Heritage to support the thrust of the Department to make teachers of Araling Panlipunan competent and effective in teaching Philippine history, awareness and appreciation of preserving and protecting historic sites and structures.
2. All district supervisors, education supervisors and teachers of history and culture, especially those who are teaching Araling Panlipunan are invited to attend the seminar-workshop. The seminar is free of charge and on a "first-come, first-served" basis.
