**2nd MOBILE TRAINING FOR TEACHERS OF THE DEAF
AS SIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETERS**

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents

1. The Special Education Division, Bureau of Elementary Education will conduct a five-day live-in Training for teachers of the Deaf as Sign Language Interpreters in the following venues and dates:

Luzon	-	GSP, Tagaytay City 12-16 April 2004
Visayas	-	ECOTECH Center, Cebu City 26-30 April 2004
Mindanao	-	RELC, Region XI, Davao City 17-21 May 2004

2. The training aims to: (a) upgrade the skills of teachers for the deaf in interpreting and in sign language; (b) establish a common sign for the vocabulary used in the schools; and (c) provide interpreting services to the deaf in the community.


3. Twenty (20) participants from each area are expected to attend. Identified participants are found in Enclosures No. 1-A, B and C. New participants should possess the following criteria:

- Has taught the deaf for at least three (3) years;
- Has completed basic and intermediate sign language;
- Is currently teaching the deaf; and
- Is physically fit.

4. Participants are advised to bring the following:

- A sign language book
- A small cassette/tape recorder
- A blank cassette tape
- A taped song to be interpreted
- A taped story to be interpreted

5. Travel expenses and board and lodging shall be borne by Christoffel Blindenmission (CBM) International. Participants are expected to check-in a day before the scheduled date. The first meal to be served shall be dinner.
6. Membership to the Philippine Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (PRID), Inc. shall be at the participant's option. Likewise, those who would like to become members shall pay for their own license.
7. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

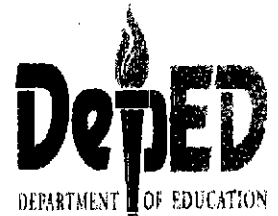

SUBJECT: US-VISIT PROGRAM

TO ALL HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS, GOVERNMENT-OWNED OR CONTROLLED CORPORATIONS AND GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS, PROVINCIAL GOVERNORS AND CITY MAYORS AND ALL GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS/EMPLOYEES:

In a memorandum, the United States Department of State Diplomatic Liaison Division/Visa Revalidation Services informed the Philippine Embassy in Washington DC that the United States Visitor and Immigration Status Indicator Technology (US-VISIT Program) has been implemented by the US government since 05 January 2004 in 115 international airports and 14 major seaports served by cruise liners in the United States. The US-VISIT is a program of the Department of Homeland Security.

The US-VISIT program involves fingerprinting, by electronic scan of the right and left index fingers, and photographing of most persons on arrival in the United States. The immigration entry/exit card system (I-94/I-94W) will still be used.

Persons subject to fingerprinting/photographing on arrival in the US:

- Non-immigrant visa holders in all other non-immigrant categories, including A-3, G-5 and NATO 7
- Diplomatic/official passport holders entering with business, exchange visitors, student, tourist, or non-immigrant visas other than A 1-2, G1-4 and NATO 1-6.

Persons not subject to fingerprinting/photographing on arrival in the US:

- Holders of A-1, A-2, G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4 and NATO 1-6 visa, regardless of type of passport (diplomatic, official or regular passport) and
- Travelers under the Visa Waiver program.
