SECOND DOON PO SA AMIN (DPSA) QUEST OF THE SMART COMMUNICATIONS, INC. (SMART)

To: Bureau Directors
Directors of Services, Centers and Heads of Units
Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Heads, Public and Private Elementary Schools

1. The Smart Communications, Inc. (SMART), through its Smart Schools Program (SSP) will conduct the **Second Doon Po Sa Amin (DPSA) Quest**, one of the three (3) major competitions under the *Doon Po Sa Amin* (DPSA) Project which provides the teacher-student teams opportunity perform basic community mapping exercises to research unique stories about their respective communities and narrate these stories on-line through their blog sites.
2. The DPSA Quest aims to:
 - a. engage the teams composed of teachers and students nationwide to generate local content of the curriculum using community mapping techniques and information and communication technology (ICT);
 - b. promote ICT integration in basic education through curriculum-based topic categories, and to encourage teachers and students to use local content in curriculum applications;
 - c. develop students' skills in research, writing, leadership, teamwork, and technology; and
 - d. encourage the schools to build relationships with other Smart Schools partners and groups within their local communities, and to rouse students' community awareness.
3. The contest is open to all bona fide teachers and students from Smart Schools Program (SSP) partner elementary schools and On-line Associates. A school may register and complete as many entries as preferred, provided each entry is qualified under any of the DPSA topic categories.
4. The deadline for the contest registration is on **September 16, 2011**.
5. All SSP partners and on-line associates (elementary schools) are required to submit at least one (1) contest entry for the **DPSA Quest Contest**. The participating schools shall be awarded points for "*School Mo Panalo*."



6. The teacher-student teams are expected to design and develop a blog site where they will present the stories of their respective communities. The stories will be based on the following topic categories:

- a. Science, Technology and Health;
- b. Environment and Disaster Preparedness;
- c. Livelihood and Economics;
- d. Arts and Culture;
- e. Language and Literature;
- f. History and Society; and
- g. Tourism and Entertainment.

7. The winners will be invited to exhibit their entries during the **Doon Po Sa Amin** Awarding Ceremony which will be held in Manila in February 2012. The winners of the **DPSA Quest** will receive the following prizes:

- a. **Grand Champion** : PhP30,000.00 for the DPSA school team and one (1) desktop for the school;
- b. **1st Runner-up** : PhP20,000.00 for the DPSA school team and one (1) desktop for the school;
- c. **2nd Runner-up** : PhP15,000.00 for the DPSA school team and one (1) desktop for the school;
- d. **3rd Runner-up** : PhP10,000.00 for the DPSA school team and one (1) desktop for the school; and
- e. **Special Awards** : PhP5,000.00 for the DPSA school team.

The Special Award are the following:

Best in Team Collaboration; Best Blog Site Design and Layout; Best in ICT Integration; and Best in Community Involvement.

2nd DPSA Quest CONTEST MECHANICS

I. Objectives

- A. To engage teachers and students to generate local content using community mapping techniques and information and communication technology (ICT).
- B. To promote ICT integration in basic education through curriculum-based topic categories, and to encourage teachers and students to use local content in curriculum applications
- C. To develop students' skills in research, writing, leadership, teamwork, and technology.
- D. To encourage schools to build relationships with other Smart Schools partners, SSP online associates, and groups within their local communities, and to rouse students' community awareness

II. Eligibility

- A. The DPSA Quest is open to all bona fide teachers and students from Smart Schools Program partner elementary schools and Online Associates (elementary schools) nationwide.*
- B. A school may register and complete as many entries as preferred, provided each entry is qualified under any of the DPSA Topic Categories (see section VI).

*As SSP Partners and Online Associates (elementary schools), your school is required to submit at least one (1) contest entry. Participating schools shall be awarded points for School Mo Panalo. Points system is as follows:

ITEM	POINTS	CORRESPONDING PRIZE
Submission of at least one (1) valid contest entry	10	-
School with at least one (1) shortlisted entry	20	-
School with at least one (1) entry which qualified as finalist	50	DVD Player with educational DVDs

Notes:

- Points are non-cumulative so the points for the highest position will be awarded.
- Points shall be awarded per school, not per school team. Points received will not depend on the number of entries. (Ex. If your school have more than one (1) shortlisted entry, you school gets a total of 20 points only.)

III. DPSA School Team

A. "Doon Po Sa Amin" (DPSA) School Team

A DPSA School Team is composed of:

- a. **Adviser** – may be a School Head (Principal, Asst. Principal, school administration official) or a Head Teacher who will provide guidance and practical assistance to the DPSA School Team
- b. **Moderator** – may be a member of the school faculty or an SSP ICT Coordinator who will provide community mapping and DPSA trainings to the DPSA School Team. Moderator will register the DPSA School Team in the DPSA Contest. Only one moderator is allowed per team.
- c. **Teacher Coach/es** – a bona fide full-time subject teacher who will provide administration, management, and facilitation of the activities/assignments/tasks of the members of the school team. A maximum of three (3) teacher coaches are allowed per team.
- d. **Student Groups** – comprised of bona fide students from within a single classroom or from

many different classrooms and levels. Each student group is headed by its respective Teacher Coach

Notes:

- *A school team may seek assistance from a local government office, community group/s, or parents who can provide practical assistance (interviews, statistical data, etc.) to the DPSA School Team*
 - *Moderator and teacher coach can be the same person and can handle more than one group.*
- B. A school team must be led by a bona fide subject teacher.
- C. A school team may have eight (8) to ten (10) members only, from within a single classroom or from many different classrooms and levels.

IV. Requirements*

1. **Official School Website hosted by Smart Schools Program**
The participating school's official website must be hosted by the Smart Schools Program.
2. **A "Doon Po Sa Amin" page**
Participating school's SSP-hosted school website must have the "Doon Po Sa Amin" tab/page where all the titles of DPSA entries will be listed.
3. **Updated school website**
Participating schools should have updated their SSP-hosted school website at least three (3) months prior to the contest deadline.

*Not required to Online Associates who were not trained and did not avail of the free hosting service of Smart.

V. Contest Entry/Output

- A. The contest entry is a blog site containing, but not limited to the following:
- a. **Title with English subtitle** – must follow the format "Doon Po Sa Amin..."
Example:
Title: "Doon Po Sa Amin, Itim ang Kulay ng Ginto"
Subtitle: "The Duhat Fruit: Our Treasure, Our Pride"
 - b. **Community Profile:** Brief profile of the community/city/barangay you are featuring in your entry
 - c. **Brief Project Description:** Overview of what your entry is about.
 - d. **Team Profile:** Members of your team and their roles/responsibilities
 - e. **Methodology:** Methods/means your group did to gather data for your entry.
 - f. **Focus Study:** Discuss the details of your entry here.
 - g. **Media gallery:** To contain the photos/videos related to your entry.
 - h. **Conclusion:** Summary of your findings.
 - i. **Recommendation:** Based on your findings, list some things you can recommend to address the issues
 - j. **Bibliography:** List of all your references/sources, properly cited. You may follow this link to learn about proper attribution of sources: <http://www.library.cornell.edu/resrch/citmanage/apa>

Reminder: All materials (data, stories, photos, images, video clips, music/sound effects, blog page design, etc.) to be used in the contest entry must be original; references must be taken from reputable sources which should be cited properly in the contest entry. Failure of properly citing

sources will mean immediate disqualification of entry.

- k. **Logos:** Upload logos of Doon Po Sa Amin, Smart Schools Program, and Smart Communications, Inc., in the entry homepage. You may download logos here: <http://ssptrainings.wordpress.com/>. See the right side of the page, "Links" section. Make sure to link the logos to their respective websites:

Notes:

- Entries lacking at least one of the said items above (Contest Entry/Output>Section A) will be disqualified.
- School teams are highly encouraged to upload images, photos, and/or videos to their blogsite entries.
- Incorporate ICT tools in your entries (e.g. links, widgets, plug-ins, comment box, etc.).

- B. A school team may submit more than one (1) entry.

VI. Topic Categories

A Student Group, headed by its Teacher Coach, can choose from any of the seven (7) DPSA Topic Categories:

1. Science, Technology, and Health

Use scientific methods and experiments to investigate and explain interesting facts or phenomena, and technology advancements in your community. Feature your community's health and wellness programs. Study and find solutions to community health issues.

Topics in this category include, but are not limited to:

- Biological life (flora and fauna) Physical geography and geology Weather phenomena
- Health and wellness
- Information and communications technology

2. Environment and Disaster Preparedness

Study and find solutions to pressing environmental and disaster-related concerns.

Topics in this category include, but are not limited to:

- Pollution
- Waste management
- Energy conservation
- Emergency response and disaster preparedness
- Natural calamities

3. Livelihood and Economics

Study and present your community's major livelihood, businesses, or industries. Investigate on the community's economic success or problem.

Topics in this category include, but are not limited to:

- Employment and labor

- Entrepreneurship
- Business and industries (community goods and services)

4. Arts and Culture

Showcase your community's arts, traditions, and cultural identity. Study and find solutions to your community's cultural issues.

Topics in this category include, but are not limited to:

- Values and customs Music and dances Fine arts and design Clothing
- Crafts
- Festivals
- Folktales, urban legends, folklore

5. Language and Literature

Study and present your community's unique language and literature.

Topics in this category include, but are not limited to:

- Dialect
- Writing system
- Literary works

6. History and Society

Present your community's history and social condition. Study and find solutions to pressing social issues.

Topics in this category include, but are not limited to:

- Religion
- Origin and history
- Governance and politics
- Famous people and local heroes (people who made an impact to the community)

7. Tourism and Entertainment

Feature your community's tourism industry and local attractions.

Topics in this category include, but are not limited to:

- Food and delicacy
- Tourist destinations and attractions
- State of local tourism industry
- Local events and entertainment

Community Impact <input type="checkbox"/> Do the stories define the community and raise awareness on community issues? <input type="checkbox"/> Are the stories appealing to a diverse audience? <input type="checkbox"/> Do the stories contribute to promoting and developing the community?	20%
