## NATIONAL SEARCH FOR OUTSTANDING SCIENCE TEACHERS AND SEARCH FOR OUTSTANDING ECOLOGICAL WASTE MANAGEMENT

The Association of Science Educators in the Philippines (ASEP) in cooperation with *Balik Handog* Foundation, (BHF), Inc., Gateway Child Centered Foundation (GCCF), Bodega Site Computer Warehouse, Inc. (BSCWI) is conducting the **Search for Outstanding Science Teachers** and **Search for Outstanding Ecological Waste Management** which started in July 2010 and will end in April 2011.

The Search for Outstanding Teachers aims to:

The Search for Outstanding Ecological Waste Management is open to all science clubs of both public and private schools which are actively involved in the different projects of their communities in relation to waste management. The club must have at least 150 members and three (3) advisers.

The awarding ceremony of the National Search is scheduled in April 2011 during the opening program of the 6<sup>th</sup> National Science Educators Convention at Teachers Camp, Baguio City.
