> IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 10% UNALLOCATED PORTION OF THE DEPED SCHOOL BUILDING PROGRAM FOR CY 2006

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents

- 1. The 10% unallocated portion of the Regular School Building Program for CY 2006 amounts to One Hundred Million Pesos (PhP100,000,000.00). The implementation of this budget will cover the following:
 - a. Replacement of school buildings razed by fire;

 Construction of school buildings in relocation sites of families affected by PNR Project;

c. School buildings with structural defects and needs immediate attention; and

d. Other requests for school buildings forwarded to the Office of the Secretary.

- 2. The procurement mode that will be applied for this particular project will be as follows:
 - a. For single or clustered projects with allocation equivalent to PhP5.0 Million and below, the Principal-led Scheme will be applied;
 - b. For single or clustered projects with allocation more than PhP5.0 Million, the National Competitive Bidding mode of procurement will be applied. The bidding shall be conducted at the Central Level.
- 3. In the construction implementation of the projects included in this budget, the guidelines set in the Principal-led Scheme which is contained in the Principal-led Operations Manual as well as in DepED Memorandum No. 246, s. 2006 shall be followed.
- 4. Funds/corresponding allotments is available at the Central Office. Likewise, obligations and payments shall be made at the Central Office following the usual accounting and auditing procedures.
- 5. Wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
