SECOND NASSPHIL STUDENT LEADERS CONGRESS

To: Bureau Directors
Regional Directors

1. The National Association of Secondary Schools of the Philippines (NASSPHIL) announces the holding of its **Second Student Leaders Congress** at Teachers Camp, Baguio City on July 13-15, 2009. The theme of the congress is ***"Preserving and Nurturing Our Heritage (Our Environment... Our Responsibility)."***

2. The congress aims to:

- a. increase student awareness of the natural and socio-moral environment and involvement in its preservation and nurturing;
- b. have a working appreciation of the scorecards (for the natural and socio-moral environment and the responsibilities played by the home, school, community, and nation in its preservation. Scorecard is a system of assessing a situation by posing and answering three questions: Where are we? Where do we want to be? How do we get there? The initial scorecard serves as basis for keeping tab of efforts in the future; and
- c. come out with do-able personal and school programs for the cultivation of responsibility among the students, and the local community, as well as for networking with other entities addressing environmental issues.

3. The participants to this congress are: a) student academic leaders, freshmen-sophomores and juniors-seniors, from selected schools from the regions to be identified by the division; b) juniors and seniors from other public and private high schools; c) faculty advisers or moderators or academic clubs; and d) the joint board of directors (students and administrators) of NASSPHIL. They will manage the congress and act as resource persons for the workshops. Attendance to this congress shall be **on official business**. Enclosed is the schedule of activities.

4. A registration fee of Four Thousand Two Hundred Pesos (PhP4,200.00) shall be charged each participant to cover board and lodging, materials and other related conference expenses. Meals shall be served from the supper of July 12 until lunch of July 15, 2009. Members of the different committees, as well as the present NASSPHIL officials and Board of Directors (students and administrators) are authorized to travel two (2) days before the congress. Travelling expenses and registration fee shall be charged against local school or local school board funds subject to its availability and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
