2010 NATIONAL LITERACY CONFERENCE AND AWARDS

To: Bureau Directors
Directors of Services, Centers and Heads of Units
Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
All Others Concerned

1. In celebration of the Annual Literacy Week, the Department of Education (DepEd), through the Literacy Coordinating Council (LCC), in cooperation and coordination with other government organizations (GOs), local government units (LGUs), private organizations (POs) or non-government organizations (NGOs) will hold the **2010 National Literacy Conference and Awards** on September 8-11, 2010 at the Teachers Camp, Baguio City.

2. In line with the priority agenda of the 2010 United Nations Literacy Decade (UNLD), the theme of the conference is "*Community Development: A Shared Responsibility to Society Through Literacy*" or *Pag-unlad ng Pamayanan: Sama-samang Pagganap ng Tungkulin sa Lipunan sa Pamamagitan ng Literasi*".

3. The objectives of this conference are to:

- a. identify and adopt ways and measures to strengthen partnership between the local government and the community in literacy programs;
- b. enable participation in development effort for the community; and
- c. generate and share ideas and experiences on literacy best practices.

4. The following participants are expected to attend said activity **on official business**:

- a. bureau, center and regional directors or their representatives; bureau/regional chiefs and assistant chiefs, regional supervisors of the Alternative Learning System (ALS) and Formal Education;
- b. schools division/city superintendents (SDS) and assistant schools division superintendents (ASDSs), division supervisors of ALS and Formal Education, district supervisors, principals/head teachers of elementary and secondary public and private schools, ALS coordinators and mobile teachers, especially those from the 5th and 6th class municipalities/districts, provinces included in the 30 focused barangays with lowest literacy rates (list enclosed);
- c. officers of government agencies with extension programs involving literacy or continuing education;



- c. officers of government agencies with extension programs involving literacy or continuing education;
- d. heads and members of non-government organizations (NGOs) involved in universalizing literacy in every region;
- e. heads of local government units (LGUs), *barangay* chairpersons, *barangay kagawad*, health workers and officers involved in the universalization of literacy;
- f. heads of private/corporate foundations with interest in education or literacy; and
- g. heads and members of academic institutions particularly those in-charge of National Service Training Program-Literacy Training Service (NSTP-LTS).

5. One of the highlights of the conference is the awarding ceremony of the top five winners of the search for Outstanding Implementers of the National Literacy Programs/Projects. These winners are selected from the LGUs (Independent Component, Component City, Highly-Urbanized City, Municipal Levels, Class A and B) for their exemplary accomplishments in literacy development through their programs and projects.

6. This is a live-in conference. Participants are requested to register on September 8, 2010 anytime between 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. The first meal is lunch on September 8 and the last meal is breakfast on September 11, 2010.

7. A registration fee of Four Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (PhP4,500.00) will be charged each participant to cover expenses for board and lodging, handouts, kits, and other workshop supplies and materials. Transportation and other incidental expenses of the participants will be charged to local funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
