**2003 SEARCH FOR THE TEN OUTSTANDING BOY SCOUTS OF THE PHILIPPINES**

To: Regional Directors  
Schools Division/City Superintendents  
District Supervisors  
Heads, Public and Private Secondary School Principals

1. The Boy Scouts of the Philippines (BSP), in cooperation with the Department of Education (DepEd) and with the support from the Coca-Cola Export Corporation, is pleased to announce the 2003 Search for the Ten Outstanding Boy Scouts of the Philippines (TOBS).
2. The Search aims to give due recognition to Scouts who best epitomize sterling qualities of school and community leadership, academic excellence and good moral character. These Scouts shall serve as role models to their fellow youth in terms of skills and values learned in the Scouting movement.
3. This year's search will be conducted in the district, local council, regional and national levels. It is open to Boy Scouts who are Filipino citizens, currently registered and at least third year high school students.
4. The Selection Committee in the regional, local council and district levels shall be composed of the following:

5. A cash prize of Five Thousand Pesos (PhP5,000.00) each, plaques and medallions will be awarded to the regional winners. The local council and the schools represented by the Regional winners will likewise be given each a Plaque of Recognition.

**TO :** All Regional Scout Directors, Council Scout Executives and Officers-In-Charge

**SUBJECT :** 2003 SEARCH FOR THE TEN OUTSTANDING BOY SCOUTS OF THE PHILIPPINES

1. To give due recognition to our Scouts who best epitomize sterling qualities of institution and community leadership, academic excellence and good moral character, the Boy Scouts of the Philippines is pleased to announce the 2003 Search for the Ten Outstanding Boy Scouts of the Philippines (TOBS) sponsored by the Coca-Cola Export Corporation.
2. The search is open to Boy Scouts who are Filipino citizens, currently registered and at least a third up to fourth year high school student only.
3. This year's search will be conducted on local, regional and national levels. Search at the district/area level is also encouraged for greater involvement of Scouts.
4. The Selection Committee on the Regional/Local Council Levels will be composed of the following:

5. Hereunder is the allocation on the total number of candidates per region as follows:

Ilocos Region	- 2
Central Luzon Region	- 2
Northeastern Luzon Region	- 2
National Capital Region	- 3
Southern Tagalog Region	- 5
Bicol Region	- 2
Western Visayas Region	- 2
Eastern Visayas Region	- 3
Western Mindanao Region	- 2
Eastern Mindanao Region	- 3

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6. A cash prize of Php5,000.00 each, plaques and medallions will be awarded to the regional winners. The Local Councils and the Schools represented by the Regional winners will likewise be given each a Plaque of Recognition. The National winners of the Ten Outstanding Boy Scouts of the Philippines for 2003 will receive trophies, medals and cash prize of Php10,000.00 each.

7. The criteria for the selection are as follows:

**A. PERFORMANCE (Council 55% / Regional 50% / National 45%)**

1. Community Service (Council 30% / Regional 25% / National 15%) – This refers to leadership and involvement of Scouts candidate in projects where the beneficiary is the community (i.e. Community Development/Service Project on Environmental Protection; Sanitation; Waste Management; Health Concerns, etc.). The community may be his neighborhood, his sponsoring institution/school, district/municipality, city/province or the region/nation. These may be tree growing, literacy program, emergency service, nutrition, education, civic duty awareness campaign, environmental protection consciousness campaign, sanitation and hygiene drive, river or canal dredging, etc.

Leadership in such activities carries more weight than just simple participation. Awards or recognition's received for such involvement will likewise be given credit.

2. Scholastic (Council 12.5% / Regional 12.5% / National 10%) – This refers to any group/organization or activity/project led or participated in by the nominee whether connected with the school or not, as long as it has some relation to academic performance. Honors/Academic Excellence and recognition's received will likewise be credited.

3. Scouting Participation (Council 7.5% / Regional 7.5% / National 15%) Scout must have participated in International / National / Regional / Local Council / Municipality / District / School events/activities in Scouting.

Awards or recognition's received in such events/activities carries more weight.

4. Scouting Advancement (Council 5% / Regional 5% / National 5%) - Scout must have reached at least the Outdoorsman rank or equivalent, in order to be given credit in this category.

**B. CHARACTER (Council 25% / Regional 20% / National 10%)**

This refers to his character, spiritual development and bearing. Certification of whether the Scout is living up to the Scout Oath and Law must be submitted together with a certification from his Religious Leader that he is faithful in the observance of his religious obligations.

Character related awards issued by any institution/group or organization as well as Religious awards will be given more weight.

**C. INTERVIEW (Council 20% / Regional 30% / National 45%)**

1. **Communication Skills (Council 10% / Regional 15% / National 25%)** – This refers to the ability to express himself in a clear, understandable manner. Convincing power will be given more credit than just the ability to express oneself.

2. **Personality (Council 10% / Regional 15% / National 20%)** – This refers to his general appearance, grooming, and bearing/posture, courtesy in manner and observance of proper decorum.

8. Rating Sheets of the Selection Committees in the Local/Regional Levels must be submitted together with the entry forms of the winners to the National Office, BSP, Manila.

9. The following is the timetable for the selection of the Outstanding Boy Scouts for 2003, to wit:

May 26, 2003	- Deadline for submission of entries for district/area Selection
June 09, 2003	- District/Area level selection and interview
June 23, 2003	- Deadline for submission of entries for Local Council Selection
July 14, 2003	- Local Council level selection and interview
August 05, 2003	- Deadline for submission of documents of Local Council winners to the Reg'l selection
August 25, 2003	- Regional level selection and interview
September 15, 2003	- Deadline for submission of documents of Regional winners to BSP National Office
October 20, 2003	- Arrival of TOBS Finalists at the National Office, BSP
October 21, 2003	- Interview of the TOBS Finalists by the National Board of Judges
October 22, 2003	- Tour (Coca-Cola Plant, Sta. Rosa, Laguna)
October 23, 2003	- Awarding Ceremony

10. The Chairman and the members of the Selection Committee at District/Local Council/Regional Levels are enjoined to be thorough and careful in the selection of candidates in accordance with the stated criteria. Their recommendations, as well as the decision of the National Board of Judges will be final.

11. Transportation expenses of the twenty-six (26) finalists to and from Manila and board and lodging while in Manila will be provided.

12. The attached Entry Form will be accomplished by the Nominee and must be endorsed by his Troop Leader and the Institutional Head and certified by the parents and the Council Scout Executive.
