SUBMISSION OF THE PRIORITY LISTS OF SCHOOLBUILDING PROJECTS TO BE FUNDED UNDER THE CY 2005 DepEd SCHOOLBUILDING PROGRAM

To : DepED ARMM Regional Secretary
Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents

1. The General Appropriations Act (GAA) for CY 2005 provides for a budgetary allocation of P2.0 Billion for the DepEd Schoolbuilding Program. Of this amount, P1 Billion shall be allocated by congressional district in accordance with the allocation criteria under RA 7880. The other P 1 Billion is set aside to address the classroom requirements of schools categorized in the Basic Education Information System (BEIS) as *Red* and *Black* Schools. Attached are the Guidelines for the Preparation of the Priority Lists of School Buildings to be funded under the CY 2005 School Building Program based on the allocation criteria under RA 7880 (Annex A). *A separate memo on the guidelines and allocation for the P1 Billion SBP for Red and Black Schools will be issued.*


2. In making the final list of priority schools, please take note of the budgetary ceiling for each legislative district and the standard cost for the different project components. The Field Offices shall determine the specific allocation for elementary and secondary levels based on actual needs provided that the actual allocation for both levels does not exceed the budgetary ceiling of the legislative district. Further, the list of recipient schools shall be drawn from the updated Instructional Rooms Analysis of the Basic Education Information System (BEIS) data (SY 2004-2005).

3. Whenever possible, ocular inspection of the proposed recipient schools shall be undertaken to assess current site conditions and to determine actual classroom needs/repair as well as the corresponding cost thereof.

4. The project listings should be duly approved by both the Schools Division/City Superintendent and the District Engineer in consultation with the Representative concerned.

5. The Priority Lists must be submitted to the Physical Facilities and Schools Engineering Division via Telefax No. (02) 633-72-63, on or before May 15, 2005.

6. Immediate dissemination of and compliance with this Order is directed.

**GUIDELINES FOR THE PREPARATION OF THE PRIORITY LISTS
OF SCHOOLBUILDINGS TO BE FUNDED UNDER THE
CY 2005 SCHOOLBUILDING PROGRAM**

I. **School Building Allocation**

- a. The appropriation for the CY 2005 School Building Program has been set as follows:

P1.0 Billion	This amount shall be allocated by congressional district in accordance with the allocation criteria mandated under RA 7880 or the "Fair and Equitable Allocation of the DECS Capital Outlay".
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P1.0 Billion	This is intended to provide additional classrooms to schools identified as " RED " and " BLACK SCHOOLS " of the Instructional Rooms Analysis of the Basic Education Information System (BEIS).
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Total P2.0 Billion

- b. Attached is the P1.0 Billion allocation by congressional district computed in accordance with the allocation criteria mandated under the Roxas Law (Annex A.1). ***The guidelines and allocation for the P1.0 Billion SBP for Red and Black Schools will be issued under a separate memo.***
- c. The division/regional offices shall determine the specific allocation for elementary and secondary levels based on actual needs provided that the actual allocation for both levels does not exceed the budgetary ceiling of the legislative district.

II. **Selection of Recipient Schools**

- A. In preparing the final list of school building projects the following should be given priority consideration.

1. Rehabilitation and Reconstruction

- ❖ Rehabilitation and reconstruction of school buildings ruined or damaged by typhoons.
- ❖ Replacement of school buildings gutted by fires and those declared condemnable.

2. Completion and Repair

- ❖ Completion of unfinished academic school buildings
- ❖ Repair of school buildings which are already dangerous to the lives of the school populace

3. New Construction

- ❖ Schools belonging to the following colored zones, as follows:

COLOR CODE	CLASSROOM-PUPIL/STUDENT RATIO	LEVEL OF PRIORITY
Red and Black	56 and above	1 st Priority
Gold	51 – 55	2 nd Priority
Yellow	46 – 50	3 rd Priority

If no school belongs to the above-mentioned color codes, schools that fall under the blue color category or with classroom to pupil/student ratio of 1:45 and below will be considered provided a justification of the prioritization will be submitted.

- ❖ Schools in communities populated by Indigenous People (IPs)

4. Other Priorities

- ❖ Provisions of potable water supply system
- ❖ Installation of electrical connection
- ❖ Construction of toilet, multi-purpose workshop (to be used for conducting home economics and industrial/practical arts classes) and science laboratories.

III. Standard Classroom Design

- a. 7m x 7m classroom design – this is patterned after that of the Federation of Filipino Chinese Chamber of Commerce Industries, Inc. (FFCCCII) design to be adopted for schools located in provinces where the classroom – pupil ratio is not more than 1:45
- b. 7m x 9m classroom design – this will be adopted in schools located in semi-urban areas or in urbanizing portions of municipalities such as the poblacion where the classroom to pupil ratio is more than 1:45. **ALL PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOLS** will adopt the 7m x 9m dimension.
- c. 7m x 9m medium rise school building design – this will be used for schools in the National Capital Region (NCR), in urban or high growth

areas or in schools where the school site is limited. At least a 2-storey structure should be planned to be constructed.

IV. **Standard Cost of School Building**

A. Academic Classroom

V. Modes of Implementation

- A. To ensure the collaboration of the non-government organizations (NGOs), local government units (LGUs) and other sectors in the implementation of the School Building Program (SBP) and, at the same time, reduce construction costs, the execution of individual school building projects shall be undertaken through any of the following modes, ranked in terms of priority:
1. Construction by NGOs such as the FFCCCII, etc.
 2. Construction by LGUs and PTCAs
 3. Construction by DPWH through contracting
- B. Attached is a list of provinces where FFCCCII has indicated its willingness and capability to implement school building projects. Their implementation capacity is estimated at 1,000 classrooms per year (Annex A-2).
- C. The division offices should explore the feasibility of the first two (2) preferred modes of implementation. If any of the two modes is deemed feasible i.e., an NGO, LGU, PTCA or DepEd entity has agreed to undertake the project and has demonstrated its capability, then the division office should work out a tripartite agreement among the DPWH District Engineering Office, the DepEd Division Office and the identified implementing entity. The Memorandum of Agreement (MOA, sample is attached for your reference, Annex A-3) should spell out, among others, the arrangements for fund transfer and disbursement, technical supervision, monitoring, etc.

VI. Mandatory Consultation

Schools Division/City Superintendents or their representatives should coordinate/consult with concerned Representative of the Legislative Districts and the DPWH District Engineer in the preparation of the final listing of recipient schools. The said listing should be jointly approved by the Schools Division/City Superintendent, District Engineer and duly concurred by the Representative concerned.

VII. Reporting Format

In preparing the list of recipient schools, the format shown in Annex A-4 should be followed. The Division Physical Facilities Coordinators should indicate their contact numbers (cellular phone, telephone number, fax number) in the list to easily get in touch with them in case clarification is needed.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This **MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT**, made, entered into and executed in the Department of Education, Pasig City, Philippines, by and between:

The **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS (DPWH)**, with main office _____ (*Office Address*) represented by _____ (*Name of Representative*), _____ (*Position*), hereinafter named and referred to as the **First Party**;

-and-

The _____ (*Name of City / Municipality*), with principal office at _____ (*Office Address*) and represented by _____ (*Name of Mayor*), hereinafter named and referred to as the **Second Party**.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the General Appropriations Act (GAA) for CY 2005 provides for a budgetary allocation of P2.0 Billion for the DepED Schoolbuilding Program. Of this amount, P1 Billion shall be allocated by congressional district in accordance with allocation criteria under RA 7880. The other P1 Billion is set aside to address the classroom requirements of schools categorized in the Basic Education Information System as Red and Black Schools.

WHEREAS, the DPWH recognizes that the _____ (*Name of City / Municipality*) have the managerial and technical capability to bid and implement the construction of school buildings;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and consideration of the foregoing premises and mutual covenants and agreements, the PARTIES hereto mutually agree on the following terms and conditions for the implementation of the _____ (*Name of Project*).

**ARTICLE 1
SCOPE AND COVERAGE**

1. This Agreement covers the Construction School Buildings in _____ *(Name & Address of School Site/s)* hereinafter referred to as "construction works" to be supervised by the _____ *(Name and Office Address of the Engineering Office of the City / Municipality)* with a total project cost of _____ *(Project Allocation)*.

**ARTICLE II
FINANCING AGREEMENT**

2. **TRANSFER OF FUNDS.** Upon receipt of SARO (Special Allotment Release Order) and (NCA) Notice of Cash Allowance from the DBM, the DPWH shall transfer funds in stages. Schedule of releases are as follows:

- 1) 15% - *Procurement and Contract Review*
The **Second Party** shall submit the following documents to the **First Party**: Invitation to Bid, Abstract of Bids, Bid proposals, Post-Qualification Evaluations, Resolution to Award and Contract Format for review;
- 2) 60% - *Progress Accomplishment*
Both Parties shall conduct ocular inspection of the project to validate actual accomplishment and ensure that the construction was done in accordance with the Contract, Plans and Specifications, and Program of Works.
- 3) 25% - *Project Completion*
Before signing the Certificate of Completion, DPWH shall conduct a Final Inspection.

Funds are allocated for the following:

3. **CONTROL, ACCOUNTING AND LIQUIDATION OF FUNDS.** Upon receipt of the Fund Transfer, the _____ *(Name of City / Municipality)* shall deposit the funds in an MDS-Trust account. All payments made from the MDS-Trust account shall follow government accounting and auditing rules and regulations as well as R.A. 9184 procurement procedures.

4. **REPORT OF EXPENDITURES.** The (Name of City / Municipality) shall submit monthly disbursement report to the DPWH within _____ days after the end of each month, reckoned from the date of receipt of the checks. The disbursements reports shall be submitted directly to the _____ . Upon completion of all construction works, the (Name of City / Municipality) shall revert any unused amount to the DPWH. Failure to do so, accountable officer shall be subject to the provisions of Article 217 of the Revised Penal code and Section 128 of P.D. 1445 re misappropriation or malversation of public funds.

ARTICLE III WORKING ARRANGEMENT AND PROCEDURES

For the efficient and successful execution of this Agreement, the **PARTIES** hereby agree to undertake the following:

5. **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DPWH.** The following shall constitute specific responsibilities of the DPWH:

- 1) To transfer and issue funding check to the (Name of City / Municipality) to defray expenses covered by this Agreement;
- 2) To review and evaluate disbursements, accomplishment and completion reports submitted by the (Name of City / Municipality) ;
- 3) The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), being the engineering arm of the government shall:
 - a) Monitor the implementation of construction of various school buildings covered by this Agreement;
 - b) Coordinate with (Name and Office Address of the Engineering Office of the City / Municipality) on the inspection and assessment of on-going and complete works;
 - c) Monitor and inspect completed construction to ensure compliance with the architectural and engineering standards;
 - d) Provide the necessary building design using DepED standards for the school buildings; and
 - e) Duly authorized DPWH representative must sign in the Certificate of Completion.

6. **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE** (Name of City / Municipality) . The following shall constitute the specific responsibilities of the (Name of City / Municipality) :

- 1) To implement the project with the Construction Works in accordance with the approved plans and specifications which must be periodically monitored by the City/Municipal Engineer's Office and acceptance documents be countersigned by its Chief;

- 2) To assign technical staff in charge of the Construction Works and coordinate with the DPWH;
- 3) To ensure that the liquidation of all disbursements be according to government accounting and auditing rules and regulations;
- 4) To ensure the submission of monthly disbursement form on or before _____;
- 5) To ensure that procurement procedures are in accordance with the R.A. 9184 procurement procedures and pertinent government rules and regulations;
- 6) To receive the funds for the Construction Works as MDS-Trust receipt pursuant to the pertinent provisions of the Commission on Audit, Circular No. 94-013 dated December 13, 1994;
- 7) To ensure that it shall open and maintain an MDS-Trust account and disburse the funds exclusively for the Construction Works and in accordance with government accounting and auditing rules and regulations;
- 8) To issue to the DPWH the official receipt for the amount of the funding check received and maintain separate subsidiary ledgers and books of accounts in accordance with the existing government accounting and auditing rules and regulations to reflect the expenditures on account of which withdrawals are made from the deposited accounts;
- 9) To ensure remittances of unexpended balance to DPWH after all Construction Works (including modifications and related activities) are completed in accordance with existing government accounting and auditing rules and regulations; and
- 10) To ensure the reimbursement/refund of ineligible payments, such as payments for Construction Works which were implemented contrary to R.A. 9184 procurement procedures.

ARTICLE IV
SCHOOL BUILDING AND MAINTENANCE

7. The _____ (*Name of City / Municipality*) shall allocate funds from the Special Education Fund for the maintenance of the school building constructed under this Agreement.
