2005 NATIONAL SCIENCE CLUB MONTH (NSCM) CELEBRATION AND
SEMINAR-WORKSHOP FOR SCIENCE CLUB LEADERS

To: Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Heads, Public and Private Elementary and Secondary Schools

1. Pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 28, the Science Club Advisers Association of the Philippines (SCAAP) in cooperation with the Department of Education-Center for Students and Co-Curricular Affairs (DepED-CSCA) and the Philippine Science Journalists Association (Psci-Journ) will celebrate the 2005 NSCM and will conduct the National Seminar-Workshop for Science Club Leaders on September 21-25, 2005 at the Cecille's Pension House, Tunaga, Zamboanga City.

2. With the theme "**Gearing Up Towards Technological Advancement through Science**", the seminar-workshop seeks to achieve the following objectives:

- a. strengthen the implementation of programs and projects in connection with the celebration of the National Science Club Month;
- b. enhance the knowledge and skills of science club leaders, teachers, coordinators and science enthusiasts on how to cope with advance technology;
- c. develop new ideas adapting new trends in technology for national development; and,
- d. apply values that focus on technological advancements.

3. Activities during the 2005 NSCM-SCAAP seminar-workshop will include plenary sessions, group dynamics, workshops, games, contests, cultural presentations and science quiz bee.


4. Participants to the seminar-workshop are the science teachers, science club advisers, master teachers, head teachers, coordinators, department heads, school principals/administrators, education supervisors, district/division/regional supervisors and science enthusiasts from the different public and private elementary and secondary schools nationwide.

5. A registration fee of Three Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (PhP3,500.00) shall be charged each participant to cover expenses for accommodation and meals from Day 0 until breakfast of Day 4, seminar kits, reproduction of modules, certificates and honoraria of speakers and facilitators. Participants shall charge their registration fees, transportation and other expenses against local school board funds and other non-DepED sources. However, participants from the private schools may make arrangements with their respective administrators for their registration fees.

6. Regional Directors, Schools Division Superintendents and School Principals are encouraged to send participants to the seminar. The Regional Supervisors in-charge of the programs and projects in science shall undertake the coordination in the field office pertaining to their respective delegation and representation during the seminar. Arrangements for substitute teachers may be made to ensure that the classes of the participating teachers will not be disrupted. In cases where schools are not able to hire substitutes, swapping of teachers' schedules may be made so that students shall not miss any science lesson.

PROCLAMATION No. 28

**AMENDING PROCLAMATION NO. 1895, BY
AUTHORIZING THE SCIENCE
PROMOTION INSTITUTE OF THE
NATIONAL SCIENCE AND
TECHNOLOGY AUTHORITY AND THE
MINISTRY OF EDUCATION CULTURE
AND SPORTS IN COORDINATION
WITH THE PHILIPPINE SOCIETY OF
YOUTH SCIENCE CLUBS, INC., THE
SCIENCE CLUB ADVISERS
ASSOCIATION OF THE PHILIPPINES,
INC., AND THE PHILIPPINE
ASSOCIATION OF SCIENCE AND
MATH SUPERVISORS, INC. TO
IMPLEMENT PLANS AND ACTIVITIES
FOR THE CELEBRATION OF
SEPTEMBER OF EVERY YEAR AS
NATIONAL SCIENCE CLUB MONTH.**

Whereas, Proclamation No. 1895 was issued on 4 September 1979, declaring September as National Science Club Month and authorizing the former Science Foundation of the Philippines in coordination with the Philippine Society of Youth Science Clubs, Inc., and the Science Club Advisers Association of the Philippines to implement plans and activities for the same;

Whereas, pursuant to Executive Order No. 784, the Science Foundation of the Philippines was abolished and in its place was created the Science Promotion Institute, an organic agency of the National Science and Technology Authority which is charged with the responsibility of promoting public consciousness on science and technology throughout the country;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and appropriate to recognize the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports and the Philippine Association of Science and Math Supervisors, Inc., as active partners in the planning and implementation of activities pertaining to the Proclamation:

WHEREAS, the youth, considered as valuable human resource has been identified as the most instrumental population group for the promotion of science consciousness, public understanding and efficient utilization of the results of research and development on science and technology in the country particularly at the grassroots levels:

WHEREAS, the Science Clubs and Societies could be the most effective vehicles in developing a science-conscious citizenry through their various experiential and participative activities for the youth which help instill in the Filipino a deep commitment to science and technology as a pre-condition to economic development and growth;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CORAZON C. AQUINO, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby authorize the Science Promotion Institute of the National Science and Technology Authority and the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports in coordination with the Philippine Society of Youth Science Clubs Inc., the Science Clubs Advisers Association of the Philippines, Inc., and the Philippine Association of Science and Math Supervisors, Inc. to implement plans and activities for the celebration of September as National Science Club Month.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the Republic of the Philippines to be affixed.
