2018 NATIONAL DISABILITY PREVENTION AND REHABILITATION WEEK

1. The Department of Education, through the Bureau of Learning Delivery-Student Inclusion Division (BLD-SID), will celebrate the **2018 National Disability Prevention and Rehabilitation (NDPR) Week** from **July 17 to 23, 2018** with the theme *Kakayahan at Kasanayan Para sa Kabuhayan Tungo sa Kaunlaran*. The theme focuses on the realization of the fundamental freedom and rights of persons with disabilities (PWDs) as provided for in existing international mandates and national laws.

2. The NDPR Week, by virtue of Presidential Proclamation No. 1270, started on June 22, 1979. The annual observance date was reset in the year 2000, to commemorate the birthdate of Apolinario Mabini on July 23 of every year.

3. The celebration aims to stimulate public awareness on the issues and problems of disability. Hence, everyone is encouraged to take an active role and participation in the upliftment of the economic and social conditions of PWDs in the country.

4. As a member of the governing board created by the National Council on Disability Affairs (NCDA), the DepEd supports the observance of said celebration by undertaking the following activities:

- a. Hanging of advocacy streamers in conspicuous places of schools/offices. Format is provided in Enclosure No. 1,
- b. Submission of Agency Feedback Report (Enclosure No. 2) upon culmination of the celebration, and
- c. Participation to activities organized by the local government units (LGUs) and Disabled People's Organizations (DPOs) listed in Enclosure No. 3.

5. The schools can select appropriate school activities which can be conducted at the school and/or schools division levels. The Special Education (SPED) centers, and public and private schools with SPED programs are encouraged to undertake activities relevant to the theme of this year's celebration. However, all activities to be undertaken should not disrupt classes nor compromise their supervision pursuant to DepEd Order No. 9, s. 2005 entitled **Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith**.

6. Relative to the celebration of the NDPR Week, all SPED centers and schools with SPED programs must accomplish the Agency Feedback Report (Enclosure No. 2) and submit it to the BLD-SID.

THE CONTEST MECHANICS

The "**Paligsahan Ng May K sa Kasaysayan at Kultura ng Pilipinas**" (the contest) is under the auspices of the **National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP)** and **National Council on Disability Affairs (NCDA)** in cooperation with the **Department of Education (DepEd)**, **Department of Tourism (DOT)** and the **Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA)**.

It shall take the following mechanics and procedures.

1. The contest will be held on 19 July 2018 at the Multi-Purpose Hall, 4th Floor, NHCP Building T.M. Kalaw St., Ermita, Manila, from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 pm. Registration will start at exactly 8:00 a.m. Contestants who will arrive after the presentation of the contest mechanics shall not be allowed to join the contest.
2. The contest shall be participated in by high school students with disabilities currently enrolled in any public or private school in any of the Divisions of the National Capital Region (NCR) and other nearby regions.
3. Previous winners in the Paligsahan ng May K sa Kasaysayan at Kultura ng Pilipinas are not eligible to join contest.
4. Students joining the contest shall submit their names to the National Council on Disability Affairs (NCDA) c/o Mr. Rizalio Sanchez at contact number 951-5013, email add iecdncda@gmail.com not later than 11 July 2018. Walk-in and substitution of students will not be accepted.
5. The contest will be divided into three (4) groups: **first group** is for the *blind and orthopedically handicapped*, the **second group** is for the *Deaf*, the **third group** is for *austism*, and the **fourth group** is for *students with other exceptionalities*.
6. Only one (1) student per category can join the contest.
7. The questions will cover *Philippine History* with focus on *Filipino struggles for freedom* (40%), *Philippine Culture* (20%), *life and works of Apolinario Mabini* (20%) and on *disability related programs* in the country (20%).
8. The media to be used will be **Filipino** and **English**. Each question shall be read twice, once in English and once in Filipino.
9. There will be **three (3) categories** of questions consisting of ten (10) items each. The **first category** will be *easy*, the **second category** will be *average* and the **third category** will be *difficult*. Each contestant shall be given *twenty-five (25) seconds* to answer each question. The Quizmaster shall give the signal to start using either a buzzer, bell or a lighting instrument. A signal will also be given to signify that the time allotment of 25 seconds is over. As soon as the signal to stop has been given, the participants shall stop writing.

10. A power point presentation of the questions will be used to facilitate the conduct of the contest.

11. Scoring shall be based on the following value points:

Category I (Easy)	10 items	5 points each	50 points

Category II (Average)	10 items	10 points each	100 points

Total Points = 300 points

12. The perfect score is **300 points**. The contestants who will get the highest points in their respective group shall be considered the ***first prize winner***; the second highest will be declared the ***second prize winner***; the third highest will be declared the ***third prize winner***.

13. Questions will be prepared to break ties. Should there be ties, a series of questions shall be administered until the ties shall have been broken. The tie-breaking questions will be treated as especially difficult questions.

14. The NHCP shall provide the contestants with answer sheets during the contest. However, the participants who are blind should bring their own braille materials.

15. The contestants shall wear their respective school uniforms and must present his/her identification documents duly certified by their Principals/Superintendents or Authorized Officials before the start of the contest or as they register.

16. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and non-appealable.

17. Sign language/Braille interpreters shall be designated/provided by the NCDA for the Deaf/blind respectively.

18. No one is allowed to make any sign language except for the official sign language interpreters during the contest proper.

19. Cash prizes will be provided by the NCDA for all winners in the four (4) groups.

20. All participants and their trainers will receive *certificates of participation, publications* from the National Historical Commission of the Philippines and *other tokens* from the sponsors.
