The National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP) invites teachers and students from both public and private schools to visit the *Museo ni Apolinario Mabini* that contains a rich trove of artefacts and memorabilia in Tanauan City, Batangas, Region IV-A (CALABARZON).

The Museum aims to:

1. offer an opportunity for visiting students/teachers, others and foreign visitors to learn about Apolinario Mabini's patriotic fervent ideals and advocacies contributing the birthing of the Filipino nationhood;
2. provide them with elearning facilities where they can readily access online history lessons and interactive exhibits utilizing modern technologies, such as hologram and augmented presentations, to make learning enjoyable and experiential; and
3. make history alive in order for them to appreciate the country's rich past.

The Museum is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. daily, except Monday.

Admission is *free* but donations will be appreciated.
