COMMEMORATION OF THE NATIONAL WEEK FOR OVERCOMING EXTREME POVERTY

- 1. Presidential Proclamation No. 717, s. 2004 proclaimed the week of October 17-23 of each year, as the "National Week for Overcoming Extreme Poverty". Likewise, the United Nations initiated in 2006, an exciting and innovative global challenge to Stand Up Against Poverty. The international campaign for this year is "Stand Up, Speak Out Against Poverty and for the Millenium Development Goals". In the local setting, the agreed theme for this year is "Kumilos, Manindigan, Labanan ang Kahirapan!"
- 2. The Department of Education (Dep ED) which is a core member of the National Anti- Poverty Commission (NAPC) together with the other government agencies, the basic sectors and other non-government organizations and private sectors shall take part in the implementation of activities lined up for the occasion. DepED's participation will include those of the central, regions, divisions and schools (including students).
- 3. The following are the suggested activities:
 - a. "Stand Up Speak Out" movement are to be organized in all public schools under the Department of Education nationwide. All actions should take place between 5 a.m. till 12 midnight, Wednesday, October 17, 2007. (see Enclosure 1 for more details)

In conducting the "Stand Up, Speak Out", everybody can join by registering in an attendance sheet prepared for the event and be counted by the party who will certify the credibility of the count which will be submitted to the UN Millenium Campaign New York (HQ) by 5 a.m. (EST) on October 18, 2007.

All are encouraged to hold a 5-minute Stand Up moment by reciting the Universal Prayer and the Pledge at the beginning of the event in order to be counted as part of the Guinness Record. (Enclosure No. 2)

- b. Relevant activities will be undertaken in some areas of the country, such as Food for School Program, food production campaign (in support of the Food for School Program), organizing fora, display of streamers in offices, schools and public places;
- c. Conduct an advocacy campaign and take action in the fight against poverty led by NAPC and in coordination with all other government agencies, local government units, with the basic sectors including the private sectors, as well as launching of public and media campaigns;
- d. Discuss about poverty reduction and inculcate awareness and encourage the reading of the enclosed universal prayer every Monday during the flag raising ceremony;
- e. Conduct of essay writing, drawing contest, or poster making contests among students using the above-stated theme; and
- f. Participants are encouraged to wear white t-shirts and/or white bands symbolizing the global fight against poverty and hunger.
- 4. All events that will be undertaken shall be enrolled using the enclosed form. All DepED offices and schools enrolled shall send their Partners' Stand Up Enrolment Form and the Partners' Tabulation Form to e-mail address: milleniumcampaign.ph@undp.org on October 17, 2007.
- 5. All DepED offices and schools are also enjoined to display the Commemoration Banner in their respective areas (Enclosure No. 3 for the suggested design).
- 6. Regional Directors (RDs) and Schools Division Superintendents (SDSs) and School Heads are requested to supervise and monitor the conduct of the aforementioned activities.

I. About the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs)

In September 2000, at the United Nations Millennium Summit, world leaders from one hundred ninety-one member countries -- rich and poor -- reaffirmed their commitment to peace, security, good governance, and attention to the most vulnerable with the adoption of the Millennium Declaration. Placed at the heart of the global agenda, they are now called the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).

The MDGs is composed of eight measurable and time bound goals that aim to (1) Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger; (2) Achieve universal primary education; (3) Promote gender equality and empower women; (4) Reduce child mortality; (5) Improve maternal health; (6) Combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and other diseases; (7) Ensure environmental sustainability; and (8) Develop a global partnership for development. Since the Philippines adopted the MDGs, it has been working together with the United Nations System in the Philippines to advocate the MDGs among the Executive and Legislative branch of government, Local Government Units, Civil Society Organizations, the private sector, academe, youth sector and the development partners community. (www.un.org.ph)

More importantly, the MDGs have been tightly integrated into the Medium Term Philippine Development Plan (MTPDP) 2004 – 2010, thus allowing government strategies, policies and action plans to simultaneously address national and MDG targets. Although there are serious challenges and threats with regard to targets on maternal health, access to reproductive health services, nutrition, primary education, environmental sustainability and glaring disparities across regions persist, the country is committed to overcoming these hurdles by 2015.

II. About the Global Stand Up Campaign

Initiated in 2006, Stand Up is an exciting and innovative global challenge of the United Nations Millennium Campaign (UNMC), which attempted to set an official Guinness World Record for the most number of people ever to Stand Up Against Poverty last October 15-16, 2006.

Once again, partners from all sectors are invited to show its solidarity and join this year's global campaign with the theme: "Stand Up, Speak Out Against Poverty and for the Millennium Development Goals.

Stand Up is a mobilization initiative designed to coincide with global mobilizations around the International Day of Poverty Eradication and the White Band Day of the Global Call to Action Against Poverty.

Stand Up aims to raise awareness of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and publicly demonstrate the growing global support for the achievement of the Goals.

Stand Up is the opportunity for organizations to be part of this global event in support of poverty eradication and the achievement of the MDGs.

It is an occasion to showcase laudable efforts and accomplishments towards the attainment of the MDGs as well as pose the challenge for sustaining and even accelerating the efforts.

III. About the National Campaign: "Kumilos Manindigan, Labanan ang Kahirapan"

Stand Up Against Poverty, the global campaign in 2006 organized by the UN Millennium campaign holds the official record title in the Guinness Book of World Record for 24 million to stand up against poverty in 24 hours on 15-16 October 2006 from 87 countries.

The Philippines' contribution was a national campaign entitled *Tumayo Tayo Pilipinas* which contributed 2.4 million Filipinos and increased awareness of the importance of MDGs with partnerships and linkages forged with civil society, local government units and the private sector

What?

Building on the gains from last year's *Tumayo Tayo Pilipinas* (Stand Up Philippines) campaign, the UN joins the Global campaign on 17 October by organizing a Stand Up, Speak Out event in the Philippines in partnership with the National Anti-Poverty Commission and the ATD 4th World.

In the Philippines, the goal is to surpass last year's target of 2.4 million Filipinos. Simultaneous and parallel events will be organized nation-wide and enrolled to adopt the local theme "Kumilos Manindigan, Labanan ang Kahirapan", a common logo, slogan and Stand Up moment. The campaign encourages a large number of national and local partners including people's organizations, national government, local government units, non-government organizations, the private sector, academe and media to participate.

We are once again inviting all Filipinos to take part by literally and symbolically asking governments to keep the promise of attaining the MDGs. This year, we would like you to help break the record so that the message is louder. Every person counts!

How Can You or Your Organization Get Involved?

Step 1: Join an Existing Event

The UN system in the Philippines is working with the National Anti Poverty Commission (NAPC) and the ATD 4th World to commemorate the National Day for Overcoming Extreme Poverty and the UN International Day for the Eradication of Poverty on 17 October 2007.

Who Can Join?

Everybody can join! Government employees, universities, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), civil society organizations, primary and secondary public schools, private sector and other key MDG partners representing the representing all sector can go to any of the organized events.

Step 2: Arrange Your Own Event

Any organization can participate anywhere when they organize their own Stand Up, Speak Out Moment!

When arranging your own events, follow the following guidelines:

Choose the location. It could be a park, a university, at your workplace.

- Choose the event between 5 a.m. 12 midnight on 17 October 2007, Wednesday. It
 could be a flag ceremony, music concert, a film screening, a school assembly you
 can be as creative as you like!
- · Erroll your event with the UN to monitor your organization's participation

All organizations enrolled in the Stand Up, Speak Out Philippines campaign are encouraged to hold a 5-minute Stand Up moment at the beginning of their event in order to be counted as part of the Guinness Record.

Simultaneous "Stand Up, Speak Out" moment are encouraged to be organized at the House of Representatives, Senate, Supreme Court, DepEd, CHED, LGUs, and other government line agencies

How to Enroll Your Organization's Event

To enroll your organizations events, follow the following steps:

Step 1: Get a copy of the Stand Up Partners' Enrollment Form (See Annex C - Partners' Stand Up, Speak Out Enrollment Form)

- Step 2: Fill-in and submit the form on-line or fax to Secretariat at 901-0200 or 901-0404, or fax to your partner UN agency (See Annex D Contact Details of UN Agencies)
- Step 3: Organize your own Stand Up event. All actions should take place between 5 a.m. till 12 midnight, Wednesday, October 17, 2006, Philippine time.
- Step 4: All organizations enrolled in the Stand Up Philippines campaign are encouraged to hold a 5-minute Stand Up moment at the beginning of their event in order to be counted as part of the Guinness Record.

People should stand up and start their event with the 5-minute Stand Up moment. Differently-abled people will be counted as long as they are present at the Stand Up moment and can perform an appropriate action of their choice.

The 5 -minutes Stand Up moment will have three steps.

1. Present the Stand Up concept, rationale and objectives. (3 minutes)

Why is this important for your organization?
What are the MDG issues you would like to see addressed?
How can your organization contribute to the attainment of the MDGs?

2. Recite the Stand Up Pledge (1 minute)
