LEADERSHIP TRAINING SEMINAR-WORKSHOP FOR THE OFFICERS
OF THE PHILIPPINE ASSOCIATION OF ELEMENTARY SCHOOL
PAPER ADVISERS (PAESPA)

To: Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Heads, Public Elementary Schools

1. The Campus Journalism Act of 1991, which is referred to as Republic Act No. 7079, provides among others that seminars and workshops may be conducted for campus journalists and school paper advisers.
2. On this premise, the school paper advisers across the country, currently officers of the Philippine Association of Elementary School Paper Advisers (PAESPA), and regional presidents not represented in the executive board, will attend a Leadership Training to be held in Tagaytay Mission Camp, Asisan, Tagaytay City on April 28-30, 2008.
3. The training program aims to:
 - a. provide a forum for a healthy sharing and exchange of ideas among participants coming from different geographical locations in order to adopt an elementary journalism program suited to the needs of the region;
 - b. enhance the leadership qualities of the current officers and regional presidents by instilling among them awareness of the journalism program; and
 - c. identify and address issues and concerns of each region regarding current practices in conducting regional contests.
4. Participants to the said training are nine (9) executive officers who will automatically represent their respective regions, ten (10) presidents of the regional school paper advisers' associations and one (1) resource speaker.

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
