**CONFERENCE-WORKSHOP ON THE MAINSTREAMING OF SAFE MIGRATION, GENDER SENSITIVITY, AND LIFE SKILLS IN FIRST YEAR CAREER PATHWAYS IN TECHNOLOGY AND LIVELIHOOD EDUCATION (CP-TLE) PROGRAM**

To: Regional Directors

1. The Joint Programme on Alternatives to Migration: Decent Jobs for Filipino Youth through the International Labour Organization (ILO), International Organization for Migration (IOM), and United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) in coordination with the Department of Education (DepEd) through the Bureau of Secondary Education (BSE) will conduct the **Conference-Workshop on the Mainstreaming of Safe Migration, Gender Sensitivity and Life Skills in First Year Career Pathways in Technology and Livelihood Education (CP-TLE) Program** on October 5-6, 2010 at the Tagaytay Haven, Tagaytay City.
2. The conference-workshop aims to:
  - a. review the first year CP-TLE curriculum as potential lens for safe migration, gender sensitivity and life skills mainstreaming; and
  - b. identify entry points to integrate concepts of safe migration, gender sensitivity and life skills in the four (4) component areas of CP-TLE, namely; *Agri-Fishery Arts (AA)*, *Home Economics (HE)*, *Industrial Arts (IA)* and *Information and Communication Technology (ICT)*.
3. The outputs or results of this activity shall be pilot-tested in the identified Youth for Employment and Migration-Child Friendly School System (YEM-CFSS) schools in the Divisions of Masbate, Antique, Agusan del Sur, and Maguindanao.
4. The expected participants to the conference-workshop are representatives from BSE, ILO, IOM, UNFPA, Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), Technical Education Skills Development Authority (TESDA), Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), Post Consumer Waste (PCW), regional/division supervisors from the YEM-CFSS project sites, CP-TLE curriculum writers and selected consultants are contained in the enclosure.
5. The participants are advised to:
  - a. bring with them officially signed authority to travel;
  - b. avail of the cheapest means of transportation; and
  - c. report to the training venue on the afternoon of October 4, 2010.




6. The first meal is breakfast of October 5 and the last meal is dinner of October 6, 2010. The participants are further advised to strictly observe these schedules to avoid disallowable expenses.

7. Traveling expenses and per diems of participants and management staff, professional fee of consultants, supplies and materials, and all other expenses related to the conference-workshop shall be charged to ILO, IOM, UNFPA Funds through direct payment modality, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
