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INTERNATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF YOUTH FOR UNESCO

The National Coordinating Body of United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) Clubs in the Philippines (NCBUCP), formerly National Association of UNESCO Clubs in the Philippines, (NAUCP) Inc., with the support of the Philippine National Commission of UNESCO, will conduct the International Assembly of Youth for UNESCO (Y4U) 2019 with the theme, Protecting Cultural and Linguistic Diversity in the Context of Global Citizenship Education, from December 5 to 7, 2019 at the University of Assumption, San Fernando City, Pampanga and Eurotel Angeles City, Pampanga.

The assembly aims to

1. serve as an avenue for youth mentoring and dialogue and peer collaborations within the context of UNESCO's mandate, observance of the 2019 International Year of Indigenous Languages and the Sustainable Development Goals;
2. draft a key document that embodies the ideas and action plans of the general assembly and the participants which, when adopted, will be submitted to the Philippine National Commission for UNESCO; and
3. strengthen the UNESCO Clubs' intrinsic mandate of being grassroots change makers, empowering them to carry on the challenge of localizing efforts anchored on regional, national, and international declarations.

The target participants are delegates from accredited UNESCO Clubs in the Philippines and other organizations wanting to become UNESCO Clubs, university students, faculty members, and nongovernment organizations.

Participation of public and private schools shall be subject to the no-disruption-of-classes policy stipulated in DepEd Order (DO) No. 9, s. 2005 titled Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith. This is also subject to the guidelines on the conduct of co-curricular and extra-curricular off-campus activities for public and private schools stipulated in DO 66, s. 2017 titled Implementing Guidelines on the Conduct of Off-Campus Activities, and the no-collection policy as stated in Section 3 of Republic Act No. 5546, An Act Prohibiting the Sale of Tickets and/or the Collection of Contributions for Whatever Project or Purpose from Students and Teachers of Public and Private Schools, Colleges and Universities (Ganzon Law).
