SEMINAR-WORKSHOP AND JUNIOR LEADERS CAMPFERENCE BOARD

The Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) of Manila, through its Elementary School Work Department, will hold its 11th YMCA National Club Advisers' Seminar-Workshop and Junior Leaders Campference with the theme, Strengthening Youth Resiliency Through Leadership Empowerment, from January 31 to February 3, 2020 at the Senior Mess, Teachers Camp, Baguio City.

The Campference aims to

1. foster awareness in positive coping by presenting different adaptive coping strategies, their specific examples, and some of the best practices on how to apply them in the real-world use cases;
2. provide psychological safety or safe spaces for the participants to effectively engage in a meaningful dialogue, as well as share their thoughts and experiences to the group without fear of judgment and unhealthy criticisms;
3. encourage them to make a conscious effort in managing their personal and interpersonal issues and therefore sustain their emotional well-being and psychosocial development; and
4. build and nourish a community of support within their social network, including but not limited to their immediate families and close circle of friends.

The target participants are selected elementary club advisers and student leaders from public and private schools.

The students and advisers will have joint sessions during the presentation of topics. They will have separate sessions during workshops and small group discussions. There will be contests such as spelling, word factory, chess (boys and girls), slogan making (English and Filipino), quiz bee (Science, Mathematics, current events and YMCA information-history), on-the-spot drawing, essay writing-student and club adviser division (English and Filipino), and Search for Mr. and Ms. Campference 2020. A regional showcase will also be conducted to feature native songs and dances.

Participation of public and private schools shall be subject to the no-disruption-of-classes policy stipulated in DepEd Order (DO) No. 9, s. 2005 titled Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith. This is also subject to the guidelines on the conduct of co-curricular and extra-curricular off-campus activities for public and private schools stipulated in DO 66, s. 2017 titled Implementing Guidelines on the Conduct of Off-Campus Activities, and the no-collection policy as stated in Section 3 of Republic Act No. 5546, An Act Prohibiting the Sale of Tickets and/or the Collection of Contributions for Whatever Project or Purpose from Students and Teachers of Public and Private Schools, Colleges and Universities (Ganzon Law).
