2021 GLOBAL HANDWASHING DAY

- 1. DepEd Order (DO) No. 10, s. 2016 titled **Policy and Guidelines for the Comprehensive Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene in Schools (WinS) Program** is designed to achieve learning and health outcomes and improve school attendance of students through a comprehensive, sustainable, and scalable school-based water, hygiene, sanitation, and deworming program. This follows the State's mandate under the 1987 Constitution to defend the right of children to assistance including proper care and nutrition and special protection from conditions prejudicial to their development as well as to protect and promote the people's right to health and instill health consciousness among them.
- 2. DepEd WinS program sets the basic requirements and standards on the **five key elements**, namely **Water**, **Sanitation**, **Hygiene**, **Deworming**, and **Health Education**. The program aims to
 - a. ensure correct knowledge and understanding among learners of effective hygiene and sanitation projects;
 - b. improve equitable access to safe water, adequate toilets, and handwashing facilities;
 - c. improve hygiene and sanitation practices among the learners to enable them to develop life-long positive hygiene and sanitation behaviors;
 - d. ensure that schools are kept clean and safe through school-based solid waste management, proper drainage, the elimination of breeding grounds for mosquitoes to prevent vector-borne diseases, and food sanitation; and
 - e. engage public and private partners in program implementation and sustainability.
- 3. DepEd, through the Bureau of Learner Support Services-School Health Division (BLSS-SHD), in partnership with the Department of Health (DOH), World Health Organization (WHO), and United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), shall organize this year's celebration of the **Global Handwashing Day** with the theme, **Our Future is at Hand-Let's Move Forward Together**. This global advocacy day is celebrated every 15th of October and is dedicated to increasing awareness and understanding on the importance of handwashing with soap as an effective and affordable way to prevent diseases and save lives.
- 4. In line with the said celebration, a one-day symposium titled *Malinis na Kamay* para sa Kinabukasan ng Bayan will be conducted on **October 15, 2021, Friday, 1:00-**

3:30 p.m. via DepEd Philippines Facebook Page. Please see the enclosed program for more details.

- This activity aims to motivate key stakeholders to promote a culture of hand hygiene by featuring best practices on encouraging handwashing behavior across different settings. To adapt to current learning modalities, the event shall feature selected videos submitted by the regions. These will highlight various initiatives in the implementation of WinS Program at the school level. Further, this event shall launch the WASH O'clock campaign as a platform for public awareness, advocacy and social mobilization in selected areas.
- In this regard, all DepEd offices and schools are enjoined to actively participate in the activity.
- All Regional and Division WinS Coordinators are requested to pre-register and be in the Zoom platform 15 minutes before the start of the activity. The same request applies to other representatives from DOH, WHO and UNICEF. The registration link for the said platform shall be provided to the Regional WinS Coordinators a week before the event.
- The regional directors, and schools division superintendents are enjoined to ensure and monitor the participation of personnel and learners to the activity.
