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INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON VALUES AND RELIGIOUS EDUCATION 2022

The De La Salle University-Dasmariñas (DLSUD) College of Education, through the Religious Education Department, will spearhead the International Conference on Values and Religious Education (ICVRE) 2022, with the theme “Values and Religious Education in Our Present Context: Perspectives, Policies, and Practices Towards Universal Solidarity, Dialogue, and Social Justice.” The Conference is scheduled for June 10–11, 2022, via the Zoom Cloud Platform.

Its objectives are as follows:

1. Provide an international platform for sharing and discussion of current issues and perspectives relevant to values and religious education;
2. Provide an opportunity for teachers to learn more about emerging concepts to enrich the field of religion and values education in general;
3. Serve as a venue for research presentations and promotion of collaboration and linkages among the participants;
4. Facilitate discussions and sharing of current practices, policies, and trends in teaching values and religious education, and inspire participants to learn and apply innovative methods in teaching; and
5. Highlight the significant contribution of values and religious education in the promotion of universal solidarity, dialogue, and social justice.

The conference is open to all teachers, values and religious educators, researchers, catechists, campus ministers, religious and lay leaders, and other professionals involved in different values formation programs and activities around the world.
