SCIENCE FILM FESTIVAL 2025

The Goethe-Institut Philippinen will hold the Science Film Festival (SFF) 2025 from October 24 to December 1, 2025, featuring both online (video-on-demand) and onsite film screenings in schools nationwide and at partner venues.

With the theme, Green Jobs: Science for a Sustainable Future, the Festival aims to raise awareness and inspire young learners to pursue careers that contribute to environmental sustainability. It will highlight professions that are essential for promoting and preserving the environment, as well as careers that support the development of a sustainable, low-carbon future.

A total of 33 films from various countries, categorized for primary, secondary, and university/general audiences, have been carefully curated by a local jury composed of science and film experts. To enhance accessibility, most films intended for primary and secondary levels have been dubbed in Filipino (Tagalog), particularly those with more complex subject matter.

Interested participants may register at <https://www.goethe.de/ins/ph/en/kul/sup/sff/srg.html> to receive a unique password. The films will be available for viewing starting at 9:00 a.m. on October 24, 2025.

The Department of Education regional offices, through their Education Program Supervisors/Regional Focal Persons for Science and Special Program in Foreign Language, are requested to submit a Viewership Report on the total number of festival viewers. Reports must be emailed to bcd.scpd.spfl@deped.gov.ph on or before December 5, 2025, using the template available at <https://tinyurl.com/SFF2025-Viewership-Report>.

The target participants include learners from the elementary, secondary, and university levels, teachers and educators, parents, science communicators, members of the general public interested in environmental careers, public and private schools, and local communities.

Participation of public and private schools shall be purely voluntary and will not hamper instructional time in compliance with the provisions of DepEd Order (DO) No. 012, s. 2025, titled Multi-Year Implementing Guidelines on the School Calendar and Activities and DO 9, s. 2005 titled Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith and the policy on off-campus activities stated in DO 66, s. 2017.

This is also subject to the no-collection policy as stated in Section 3 of Republic Act No. 5546 also known as An Act Prohibiting the Sale of Tickets and/or the Collection of Contributions for Whatever Project or Purpose from Students and Teachers of Public and Private Schools, Colleges and Universities (Ganzon Law).
